SOCIAL DISTANCING THROUGHOUT THE TRIP

Maximizing social distancing is key. This can be most effectively accomplished by using crew vans or having single employees in a vehicle. As this is not possible in every scenario, try to utilize the following guidelines for employee spacing in vehicles:

Sedan/SUV/Super crew pickup:

2 Occupants

Driver and one (1) Rear Seat Passenger (Right Side)

Regular or Super Cab Pickup:

1 Occupant Driver Only

Passenger Van:

of occupants varies by seating configuration Driver only and one (1) passenger per seat row

(1st seat row passenger sits on right side, passengers behind sit opposite side)

TRACKING

It is critical that we track potential exposures on our projects to minimize the impact. Tracking can be done by trying to keep the same crew members traveling together day after day or keeping a sign-in sheet with the vehicle.

PASSENGER HYGIENE PRACTICES

Practice good hygiene before and during transportation in all vehicles. All employees should wash their hands before entering a vehicle. Employees should not touch their face during transport and if they need to cough or sneeze to do so in their elbow. Employees should consider wearing face protections and disposable gloves while in the vehicle.

VEHICLE HYGIENE PRACTICES

The driver (or operator) should clean all common areas that might be touched including the external door handles, keys and other internal areas. Cleaning of contact points should be done using antibacterial wipes or a wet cloth with soap or equivalent.
